# **LORD HAVE MERCY**

*Mt. 15:22 – Canaanite Woman* / *Mt. 17:14-15 – Son w/Seizures*

*Mt. 20:29-31 – 2 blind men* / *Mt. 23:23 - Justice, Mercy & Faithfulness*

*Lk. 17:12-13 – 10 lepers* / *Lk 18:9-14 – Pharisee & Tax Collector*

## 2<sup>nd</sup> of 10 – Definition of Mercy!

2. Please God,



- a. Temporal → Divorce / Job / Health / Kids
- b. Eternal → Most of all – stand before God – final judgement!

### 3. Begins from a place of **WEAKNESS** or **HELPLESSNESS!**

a. Not a negotiation!

*Come on – can you cut me a break!*

Mercy = total helplessness

b. 26 synonyms for helpless → → → → →

c. Weakness = Broken – every major positive character in the Bible!

i. Flesh → Defend / Fight / Deny

ii. Re-Train your Brain → Strength = Broken!  
*(Training a Dog) (Offensive?)*

II Cor. 12:9-10 But he said to me, “My grace is sufficient for you, for **my power is made perfect in weakness.**” Therefore I will **boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses**, so that **Christ’s power may rest on me.** <sup>10</sup> That is why, **for Christ’s sake, I delight in weaknesses**, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties.

For **when I am weak, then I am strong.**

#### 4. Mercy assumes **REPENTANCE!**

- a. Luke 15 Parable of Prodigal son – son repented
- b. John 8:10-11 – Go now and leave your life of sin



#### 5. Mercy can be asked for when battling trying to **FLEE temptation!** I Cor. 10:13, Heb. 2:18

#### 6. Lamentations – His mercies are **NEW every morning!!!**

*Lamentations 3:22-23 It is of the **LORD'S mercies** that we are not consumed, because his compassions fail not. They are **new every morning**: great is thy faithfulness.*

## 7. Jesus referring to a verse “ I DESIRE MERCY NOT SACRIFICE”

- a. Mt. 9:12-13 – Jesus response to their accusations against his hanging with sinners.
- b. Mt. 12:7 – short time later – Pharisees accusing disciples of eating heads of grain.



Mt. 9:12-13 On hearing this, Jesus said, “It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick.

But **go** and **learn** what this means:

**‘I desire mercy, not sacrifice.’**

For I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners.”

Mt. 12:7 **If you had known**

what these words **mean**,

**‘I desire mercy, not sacrifice,’**

you would not have condemned the innocent.

## 8. Mercy **leads** to **FAVOR**

- a. Both require Faith – Trusting God to fill in the gap
- b. David – Prayed both prayers more than any other man! 100 each.
- c. II Sam. 7:15-16, 19

I Sam. 7:15-16 KJV But my **MERCY** shall **not depart** away from him,  
NLT But my **FAVOR** will **not be taken** from him

**as I took it from Saul**, whom I put away before thee.

<sup>16</sup> And thine house and thy kingdom shall be established for ever before thee:  
**thy throne shall be established forever.**

v. 19 Do you **deal with everyone this way**, O Sovereign Lord?

## 9. Mercy is the **opposite** of **JUDGEMENT!**

- a. Judgement /Justice – what we **DESERVE** in any situation
- b. Judgement comes from **strength**, Mercy is received from **weakness**
- c. **Cannot understand** mercy unless we understand judgement
